

Report on Divisions 3 and 4 Weekend 4 by Steve Burke

Apologies for not providing a report after Weekend 3, and this brings with it a question of how to cover the changes since Round 4. In the end I decided to take an overview approach. Particularly in relation to Division 3 South, where the initial groups were concluded and the promotion and relegation groups started.

From Pool A, three of the top four maintained their places, but a big push by Cambridge University saw them overhaul the Anglian Avengers. This brings with it safety from relegation, but (like Rhyfelwyr Essyllwg) they bring forward all their losses to the new group and will struggle to make an impact on the top spots.

The first round of matches in the new group went pretty much according to expectation. So the group looks to be a fight between the top five teams, with several of them playing each other, they will all start the final weekend with high hopes.

Pool B saw the top four all retain their places, but with differing fortunes. While Brown Jack and CSC stormed ahead, Oxford lost all three matches. So they are safely in the promotion group, but bringing forward only 1 point.

Compared to the group above, this relegation group was full of surprises. The Sussex Martlets and The Full Ponty both overcame serious rating deficits to win, while The Rookies also had a big win in a supposedly even match. Looking forward, it's really hard to say who will finish in the bottom four, but obviously having points on the board already makes the current top four favourites.

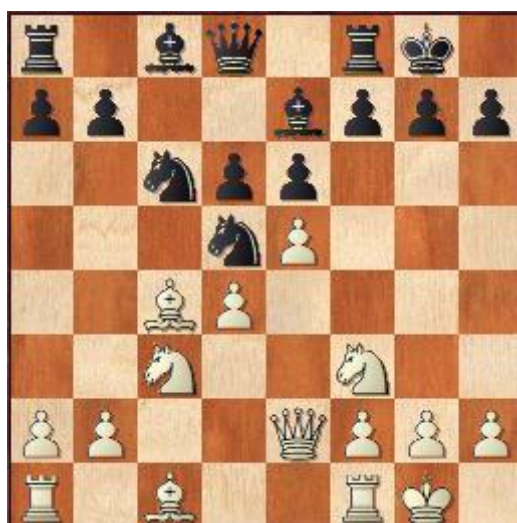

1.e4 c5 2.c3 Nf6 Having chosen this over the main alternative 2...d5 both players head down the main line for several moves.

3.e5 Nd5 4.d4 cxd4 5.cxd4 e6 6.Nf3 d6 7.Bc4 Nc6 8.0-0 Be7 9.Qe2 0-0 10.Nc3

11.bxc3 b6!? This is where the game departs from main line theory. After 11...dxe5 12.dxe5 Grischuk chose 12...b6 13.Rd1 Qc7 14.Bd3 Bb7 15.h4 Rfd8 16.Bf4 Rd5 17.Bc2 Rxd1+ 18.Rxd1 Rd8 19.Rc1 Rd7 20.Nd4 Nxd4 21.cxd4 Qd8 22.Be3 Bxh4 23.Kh2 g6 24.Qg4 Be7 25.Rh1 Rc7 26.Bxg6 fxg6 27.Qxe6+ Kh8 28.Kg1 Qg8 29.Qg4 Bd5 30.Bg5 Qe6 31.Qg3 Kg8 32.Rh4 Bxg5 33.Qxg5 Qe7 34.Qh6 Rc8 35.a4 Rf8 36.f3 a6 0-1 (36) Vachier Lagrave,M (2758)-Grischuk,A (2810) Beijing 2014

12.Bd3



12...d5? This transposes to a dubious French position. Whereas 12...Bb7 stays flexible.

13.Qc2 h6 14.Bf4+/- White could probably save a tempo with 14.Qe2+/-

14...a5?! If black could follow this up with Ba6 it would be fine, but white prevents this, so better was 14...Na5 15.Qc1 Qc7+/-

15.Qe2! Re8 16.Rfe1



16...Bf8?! Premature prophylaxis? 16...Nb8 17.Bc2 Ba6 18.Qd2 Bf8+/-

17.Rab1 Bd7?! [17...Nb8 18.g4 Be7 19.Kh1 Ba6+/-]

18.Bc2!?



Setting up a "Fioni Attack"!

Komodo gives 18.g4! Ne7 19.Bd2 g6 20.h4 Qc7 21.h5 g5 22.Nh2 Rac8 23.f4 gxf4 24.Qf2 Bg7 25.Bxf4+-

18...a4?? This appears to be a fatal loss of time.

Black needed to bring reinforcements to the kingside, 18...Ne7 19.Qd3 Ng6 but does need to see how to deal with 20.h4!? (20.Bd2 Be7+/-) 20...Bc8!



Here white needs to find 21.Bg5! though over the board it would be a leap of faith to offer this piece sacrifice. (21.h5? fails to 21...Ba6! 22.Qe3 Nxf4 23.Qxf4 b5=/+)
21...Be7 (The refutation of 21...hxg5?? depends on some lengthy variations, starting

with 22.Nxg5!! Qd7 23.Qf3 Ba3 24.Qh5 Nf8 25.Bh7+ Nxh7 26.Qxh7+ Kf8 27.Rb3 Qa4 28.h5 Ke7 29.Qxg7 Kd7 30.Qxf7+ Kd8 31.h6+-) 22.Bxe7 Rxe7 23.Qd2+/=

19.Qd3 g6 20.Qe3



20...Kh7? This looks the natural defence, but black has much better chances of surviving after 20...h5! and for example 21.Ng5 Qc7 22.Bd3 Reb8 23.Qh3 f5! 24.Qg3 Bg7 25.Nh3 Be8+/- though it might still be losing.

21.h4!! White is clearly better, but this thrust is needed to take full advantage.

21...Ne7 22.g4



22...Qc7 Black might hold the kingside better with 22...Bg7 23.h5 Rh8 24.Kg2 Kg8 25.Rh1 Qf8 26.Rxb6+- but then he loses a pawn and the attack still rages.

23.h5 Rec8 24.Rbc1+- Trying to create some counter-play. White could ignore this with 24.Kg2 Qxc3 25.Bd3+- but white has plenty of time to defend the pawn first.

24...Bg7



25.Kg2 White has several ways to break through, e.g. 25.g5 hxg5 26.Nxg5+ Kg8 27.hxg6 fxg6 28.Qh3 Qxc3 29.Qh7+ Kf8 30.Re3 Qb2 31.Rf3 Rxc2 32.Rxc2 Qxc2 33.Bd2+ Nf5 34.Bb4+ Ke8 35.Qg8+ Bf8 36.Qxf8#

25...Rh8 26.Rh1



26...Ng8 Running with the king doesn't save black, 26...Kg8 27.hxg6 Nxg6 28.Bxh6 Kf8 29.Bxg6 fxg6 30.Qf4+ Ke8 31.Bxg7+-

27.Ng5+ Here 27.hxg6+ fxg6 28.Ng5# would be a nice finish, but how often do you get the chance to give mate with a pawn check?

27...hxg5 28.hxg6#
